the Council reaffirmed that the GEF stands ready to continue to support the operationalization and activities of the Climate Technology Centre and Network (CTCN) in response to UNFCCC Decision 2/CP.17, and in line with GEF procedures.

36. Furthermore, the Council approved them with the understanding that they will seek, as appropriate, to collaborate with the future Climate Technology Centre to be set up in the framework of the UNFCCC.

37. With respect to the PIFs approved as part of the work program, the Council finds that each of these PIFs (i) is, or would be, consistent with the Instrument and GEF Policies and procedures, and (ii) may be endorsed by the CEO for final approval by the GEF Agency, provided that the final project documents fully incorporate and address the Council's and the STAP reviewer's comments on the work program, and that the CEO confirms that the project continues to be consistent with the Instrument and GEF policies and procedures.

38. With respect to any PIF approved in this work program, the final project document will be posted on the GEF website for information after CEO endorsement. If the GEF CEO determines that there have been major changes to the project scope and approach since PIF approval, the final project document shall be posted on the web for Council review for four weeks prior to CEO endorsement.

39. The detailed funding decisions taken by the Council during this 42nd Council meeting are included in Table 1 annexed to this Joint Summary of the Chairs.

Highlights of the Council Decisions

Agenda Item 13 Work Program

15. The Council unanimously expressed its support and satisfaction with the robustness of the work program and congratulated the Secretariat, the donors, the countries, STAP and the GEF Agencies for a job well done.

16. A number of Council Members expressed concern regarding the lack of international waters projects, which is an area of importance for SIDS and coastal countries. Other Council Members also noted the absence of projects within the SIDS constituency and expressed hope to see more support for SIDS projects in subsequent work programs. One Council Member commented on the reason for having few projects in the SIDS countries as due to the lack of good executing agencies.

17. Several Council Members expressed concern over the low level of projects approved under the International Waters focal area; noting that these represented less than 4% of the total work program. The Secretariat was requested to ensure a more robust programming under this focal area in order to ensure that the amount allocated under GEF-5 is assigned. It was noted that it would be a shame if the so-called “Tragedy of the Commons” were to be repeated in GEF allocations.

18. The CEO clarified that not every work program can be fully balanced, in terms of geographical diversity, focal area, or resource allocations as submissions vary from work program to work program. Besides, the GEF is only halfway through its current replenishment cycle; at the end of the replenishment period, a better judgment can be made on whether there is a balance in the division of resources geographically or by focal area.

19. Several Council Members highlighted a number of outstanding and innovative projects and expressed their satisfaction regarding their inclusion in the work program. One Council Member welcomed the inclusion of the two public-private partnership programmatic approaches and suggested that as part of GEF Secretariat review of individual projects under the programs, particular attention be paid to ensure that the projects meet the global environmental benefits, and adhere to GEF environmental and social safeguards.

20. Several Council Members representing the SIDS raised the issue of the increasing difficulties faced by SIDS in providing the co-financing required of their projects and asked if there could be some flexibility. They also requested a review of the Global Environmental Benefits Index in the STAR to strengthen the marine biodiversity index.

21. Several Council Members expressed concerns about the three regional projects on climate technology transfer submitted in the work program in view of the on-going negotiations under the framework of the UNFCCC, and affirmed that these projects be developed for complementarity vis-à-vis with the CTCN network.

22. One Council Member requested the Secretariat to give more technical support for capacity building, particularly in the development of projects in Africa.

23. One Council Member expressed satisfaction on the number of multi-focal area projects in the work program.

24. The CSO representative provided analysis on the work program and expressed concern that there are projects that have not referenced CSO involvement and urged Council that public involvement policy be more forcefully applied in GEF projects.

25. A Council Member requested clarification on how the GEF would have surpassed the overall GEF-5 program target in million tonnes of CO² equivalent with the climate mitigation projects presented in the work program. The CEO pointed out that the question was fully explained by paragraph 37 in the cover note.

26. Several Council Members, including the CSO representative, have indicated that they will provide written comments on some projects to the GEF Secretariat for consideration by the Agencies.
