The project will lead to preparation and submission of its fourth NC and fourth BUR by December 2023, and increase Indonesia's transparency capacity.

In the project preparation, the stakeholder to be engaged include not only government but also the private sectors directly involved in the implementation of mitigation and adaptation activities contributing to the achievement of the NDC target, local communities and non-government organizations will play roles in implementing pilot and data collection, and academic institutions and universities, which will participate in designing and implementing capacity building activities for adaptation and mitigation and supporting the implementation of pilots including research for the development of local emission factors.
